Additionally, considering inflation and the procurement timeline, an additional 10% of the allocated amount, is also approved. The establishment of the Central Testing Facilities Centers is essential for enhancing research and consultancy and testing capabilities.
Item No. 61.02.06	Report of new recruited faculty
	In accordance with the approval from DTE as per letter no. 4(2)/ Aastha/ anu. niyukti manyata/ 2023/ 112 dt. 11.03.2024, VJTI dispatched appointment letters to all newly recruited faculty candidates. The appointed candidates are required to join within one month of receiving their appointment letters. However, recognizing that some candidates may need to adhere to a 3-month notice period before getting relieved from their current positions, it is recommended that their requests for an extension of the joining period be accommodated, allowing them to join within 3.5 months after the acceptance of their request. BoG approved the report on Faculty recruitment and extension in the joining period upto 3.5 months.
Item No. 61.02.07	Approval to Convocation budgetary expenditure amounted Rs. 23,75,000/-
	The Board of Governors has approved the budgetary expenditure for the Convocation ceremony, totalling Rs. 23,75,000, which encompasses various necessary expenses for the event, as outlined in the attached budgetary expenses document (Annexure – 61.02.07).
Item No. 61.02.08	Utilization of New Infrastructure Budget
	The Board of Governors has approved the allocation of accumulated income towards infrastructure development, encompassing various areas such as research infrastructure, academic classrooms and laboratories, student hostels, faculty cabins, office infrastructure for staff members, and purchase of academic and research equipment to enhance teaching and research facilities.
Item No. 61.02.09	Payment of Advance Tax on income accumulated income during FY. 2018-
	The Board of Governors is requested to approve the payment of Rs. 7 Crore as an advance tax against the income accumulation from FY 2018-19, totalling Rs. 25.1 crore, in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Despite efforts to utilize the accumulated amount within the stipulated five-year period for asset creation, the unspent balance of Rs. 21,24,02,936/- is now subject to taxation. The institute plans to disclose all relevant details and take a defensive stance in the return of Income for FY 2023-24, citing reasons such as the absence of the Board of Governance for crucial decisions and the Supreme Court's extension of the limitation period. While acknowledging potential litigation from tax authorities, the institute aims to mitigate tax liabilities by disclosing expenditure plans and

	actual expenses incurred. Moreover, the Trust is committed to ensuring proper monitoring and documentation of expenditure from the accumulated income, emphasizing capital nature and accurate debit transactions. The approval of the Board is sought for these actions. The Board of Governors approved the request for the payment of Rs. 7 Crore as an advance tax against the request.
Item No. 61.02.10	Payment of Tax on accumulation of Rs. 15,00,00,000/- for FY 2016-17
	The Board of Governors has approved the institute's decision to appeal against the disallowance of the accumulation of Rs. 15,00,00,000/- under Section 11(2) of the Income Tax Act, 1961, due to delayed filing of Form 10. The order issued under Section 143(3) of the Income Tax Act, 1961, resulted in a demand of Rs. 7,09,28,035/-, including interest. Despite the expiration of the time limit for expenditure in FY 2016-17 and the subsequent demand raised, no expenditure was made nor taxes paid in the succeeding years. The institute awaits the outcome of the appeal and the condonation request filed with the Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemptions) for the FY 2016-17, keeping the payment of taxes on hold until a resolution is reached.
